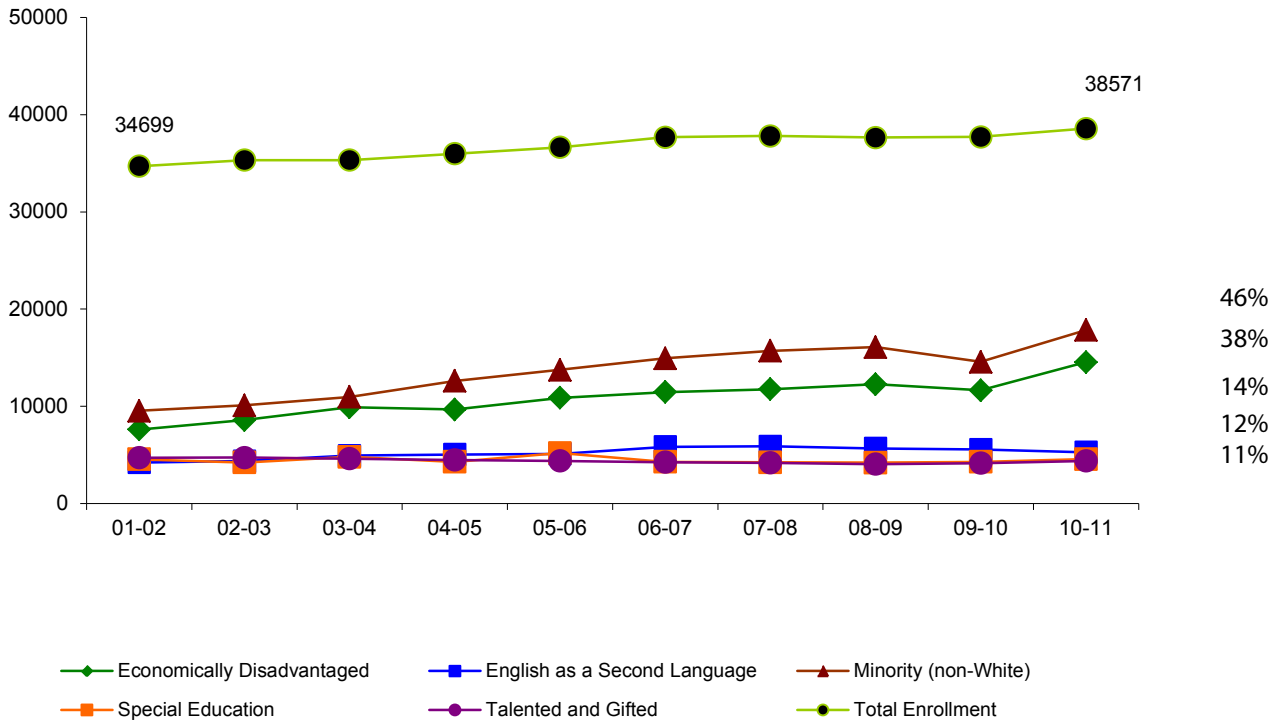

Beaverton School District Annual Statistics

In the last ten years, the enrollment of students at Beaverton School District has grown 11% (up 3,872 students). During that time, the percentage of minority students has risen from 27% to 46%. The largest minority student group is Latino/Hispanic, followed by Asian Americans.

The percent of students who qualify for federal funds that provide lunch free or for a reduced-price, a percent which is often used to estimate how many students are economically disadvantaged, has risen in Beaverton during the past ten years from 22% to 38%.

The percent of students who are English Language Learners has risen from 12% to 14% during the past ten years.

The percent of students in the Talented and Gifted program has fallen from 14% to 11%. The percent who qualify for Special Education has also fallen in the past ten years, from 13% to 12%.

#### Understanding Student Performance Measures and Reports of Results

Many people ask what is the difference between the Oregon standardized test (OAKS), Adequate Yearly Progress as defined by the Federal No Child Left Behind Act, the Oregon "Report Card" for districts and schools, the Beaverton School District marks on their elementary school child's report card (expressed in terms similar to state tests); and how any of these relate to the well-known SAT or ACT tests. The following addresses these definitional issues.

#### **Oregon Assessment of Knowledge and Skills:**

Assessments that comprise the Oregon Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (OAKS) are designed to meet public purposes set forth in key pieces of legislation. In broad strokes, Oregon's assessments can be used to show how well individual students have mastered Oregon standards and to demonstrate the effectiveness of schools and districts in preparing students to meet standards. Test reporting and construction are therefore closely linked to state academic content standards.

Note that on the pages that follow containing percent meeting or exceeding standards by grade level and school for different subjects, blank cells indicate that the school was not open in that year, that the school did not offer enrollment in that grade during that year, or that the OAKS system did not publish test scores in that subject area during that year.

The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB, Public Law 107–110) requires the state of Oregon to annually determine whether schools, districts, and the state have made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) toward the goal of having all students meet rigorous state academic standards by the 2013-2014 school year. Each year, the performance of all students in the school, district, and state as well as demographic sub-groups of students, is measured using the Oregon Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (OAKS) and the results are compared against annual performance targets.

At the school level, if the school as a whole and all demographic sub-groups meet the statewide participation and academic achievement targets in English/Language Arts and Mathematics, and the school meets the statewide target for either attendance (in elementary and middle schools) or graduation rates (for schools with grade 12), the school is designated as making or meeting AYP. If any sub-group of students or the student body as a whole in a school does not meet the targets, or does not make sufficient progress toward the targets, the school is designated as not meeting AYP.

***Oregon School and District Report Cards***

Oregon law and the federal No Child Left Behind Act require the Oregon Department of Education to produce and issue annual report cards for schools and districts. The purpose of the Oregon School and District report card is to communicate information to parents about school progress and achievement while meeting the legislative expectation for school and district accountability. The Oregon report cards are issued each autumn. In the Beaverton School District, these are sent home with each student prior to January 15th. The ODE drew on significant public input in developing report cards that meet state and federal legal requirements. Oregon school and district report cards contain information about student participation in and performance on the OAKS tests, whether the school or district met AYP in each required area, and information on school demographics, staffing, student attendance and dropout rates. Schools receive an overall rating as required by state law based on participation on state tests, test scores, and attendance and graduation rates.

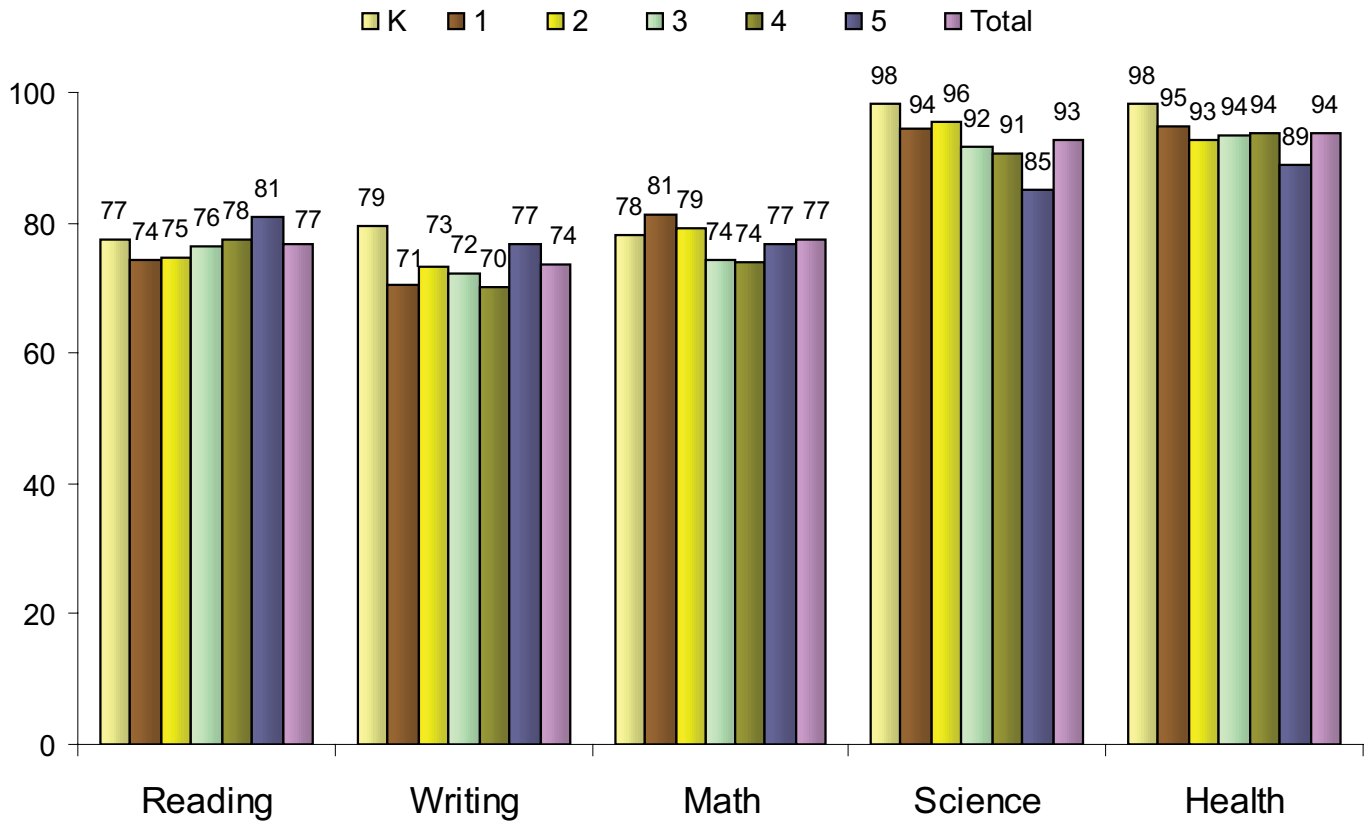

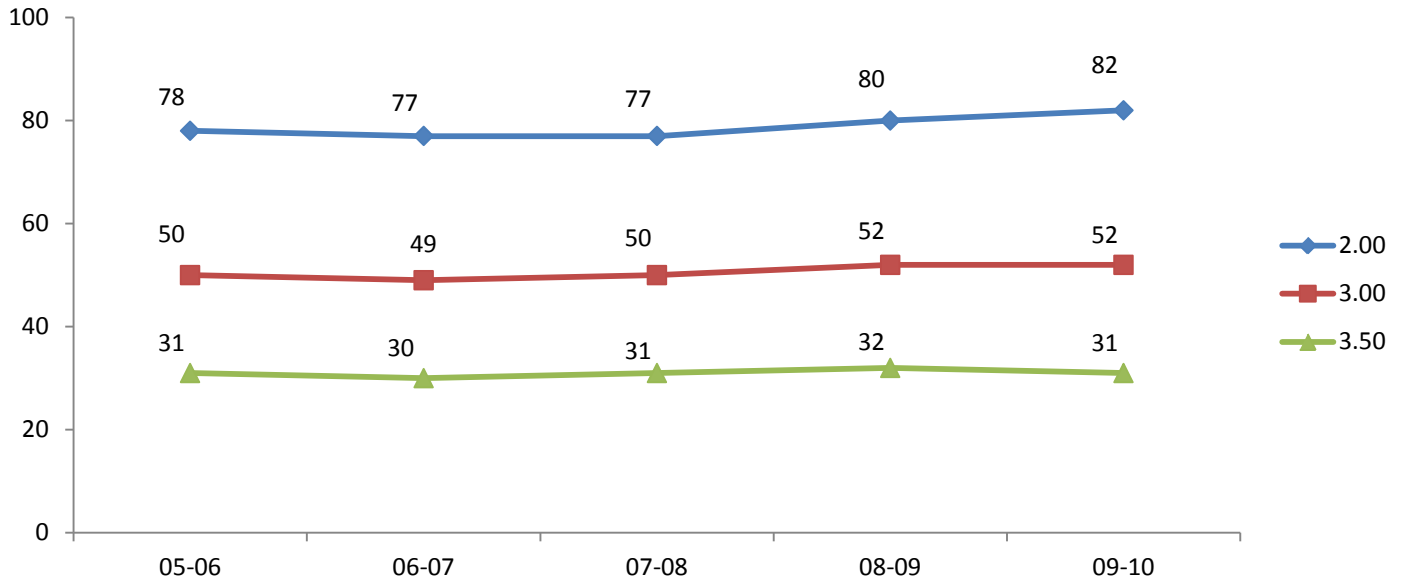
## SECONDARY STUDENTS WITH A YEAREND CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE OF 2.0 OR HIGHER

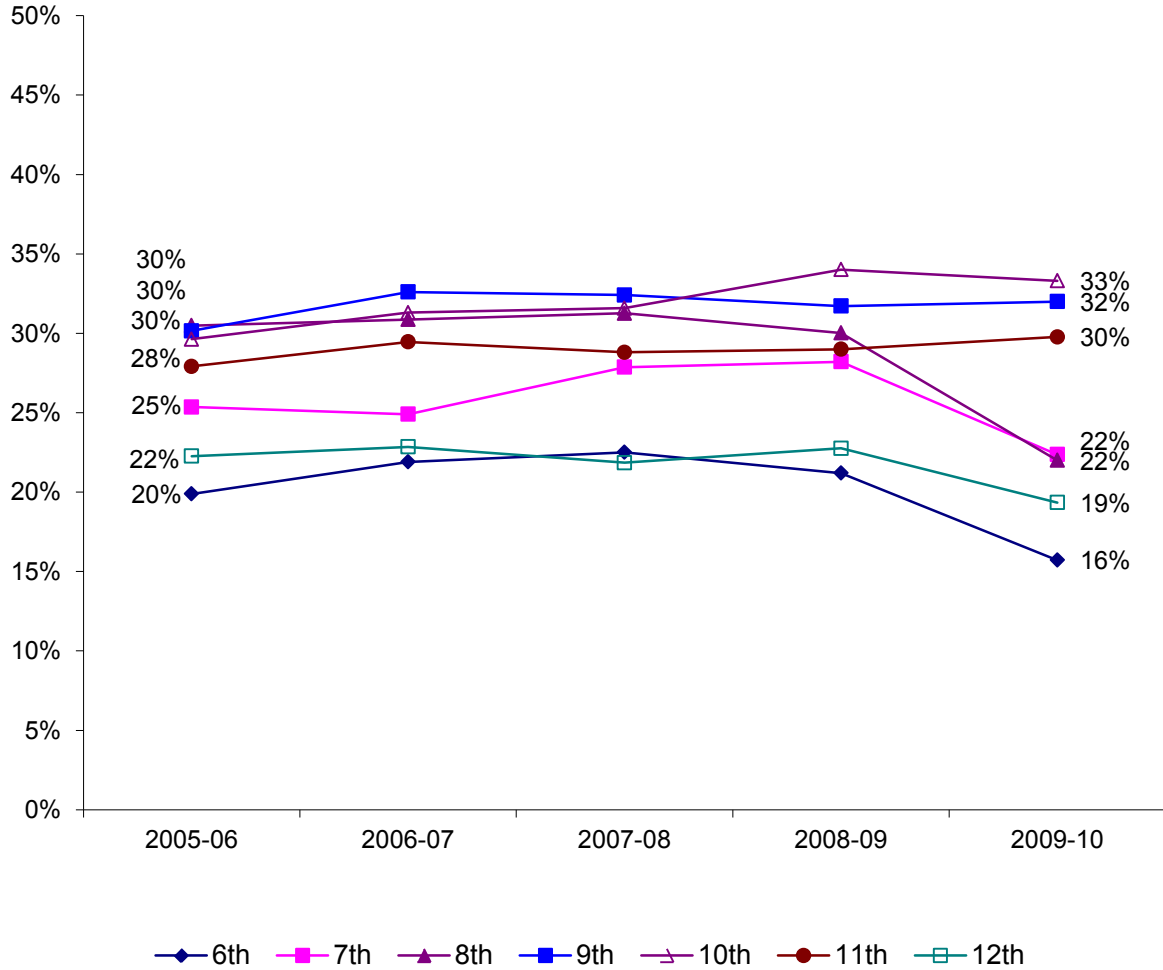

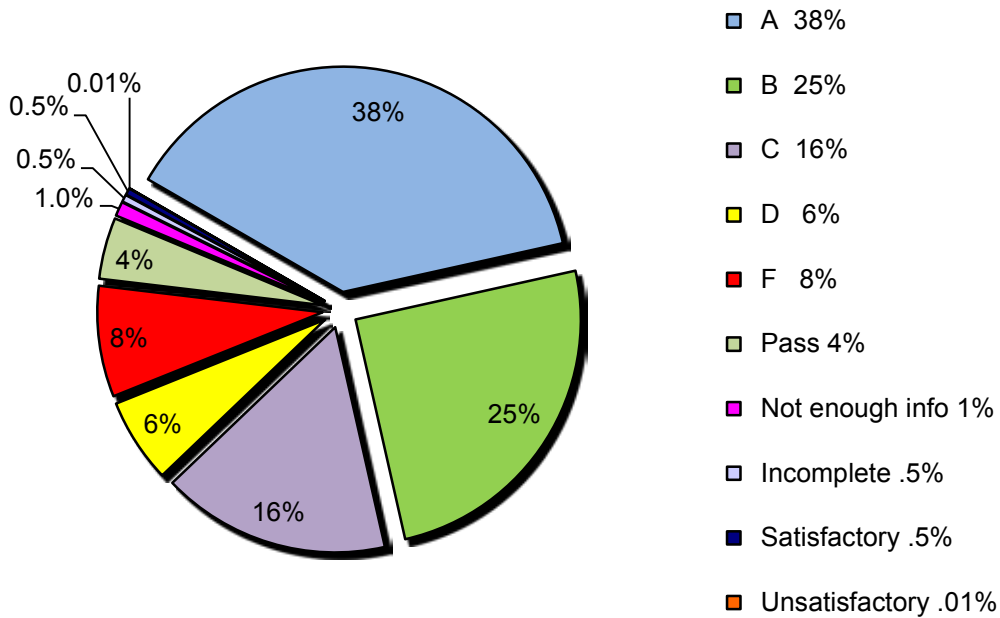

Credit deficiency is the most important predictor of dropout, and course failure is the main reason for credit deficiency. Credits earned are a result of how many courses a student takes, and what grades are earned.

Grades that confer credit include A, B, C, D, Pass and Satisfactory. Because the State of Oregon requires that high school students earn 24 credits to graduate, students need to earn 6 credits each year to stay on track for graduation. In 2009-10, 82% of 9th graders earned at least 6 credits, 83% of 10th graders earned 12 or more, and 79% of 11th graders earned 18 or more.

For the class of 2011, the Oregon Department of Education requires that students complete 4 years of English Language Arts; 3 years of Mathematics; 2 credits in Science; 3 in Social Science; 1 in Career or Technical Education, Arts or a second language; 1 in Physical Education, 1 in Health Education, and 9 Electives. Beginning with the class of 2012, Oregon requirements for high school graduation will increase to 3 credits in Science, and 3 credits in Career or Technical Education, Arts or a second language, and will decrease to 6 credits in Electives.

Since 1998, average SAT scores have not changed a great deal, despite fluctuations. In 2005, BSD implemented a new SAT test in Writing, a modified test for Mathematics, and a modified test for Critical Reading (formerly called verbal skills).

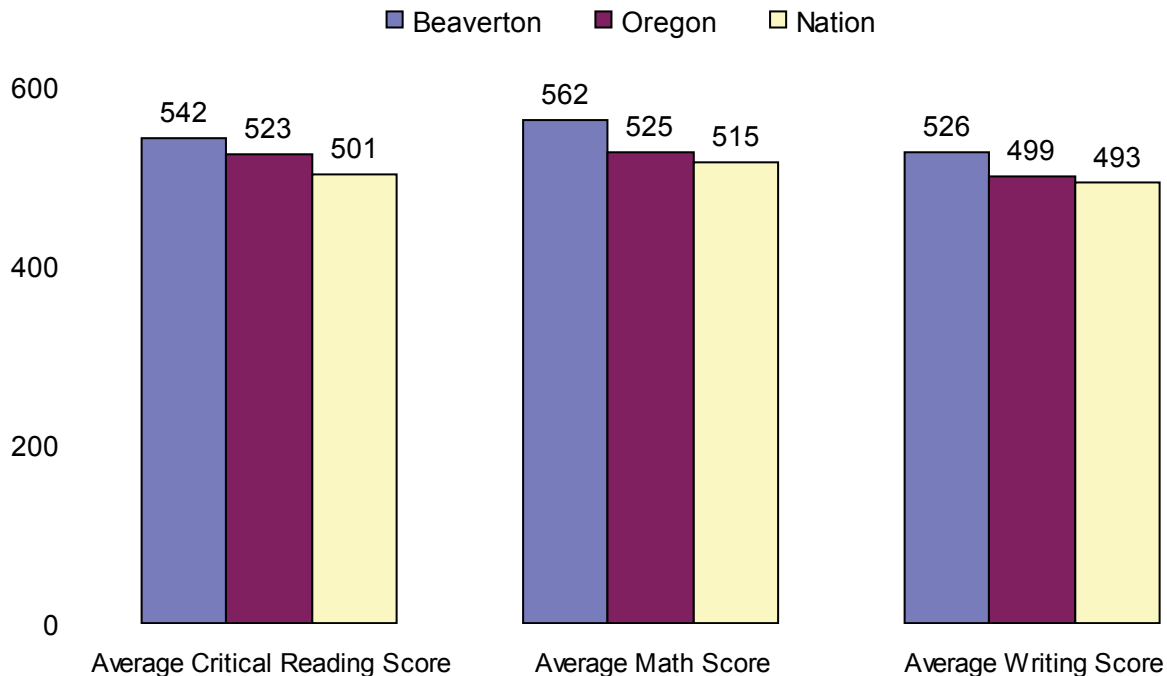
According to College Board technical notes, more than half of all high schools experience score changes of at least 10 points up or down from one year to the next. In 2009 at Beaverton, average scores in Critical Reading rose 2 points, to 542. Average Math scores rose 2 points, to 562. Average Writing scores rose 4 points to 526.

BSD students continue to outscore other students in Oregon and the nation. Fewer students took the SAT in 2009 (1,125) than in 2008 (1,211). In 2009, test-taking students comprised 38% of seniors, down from 41% the year before. SAT participation decline may be due to the mandatory ACT testing undertaken by Beaverton School District in 2006. All colleges and universities will accept either the ACT or SAT test from college applicants, and there is no charge to BSD students for taking the ACT.

**2009 SAT Scores for BSD, Oregon, and U.S.**



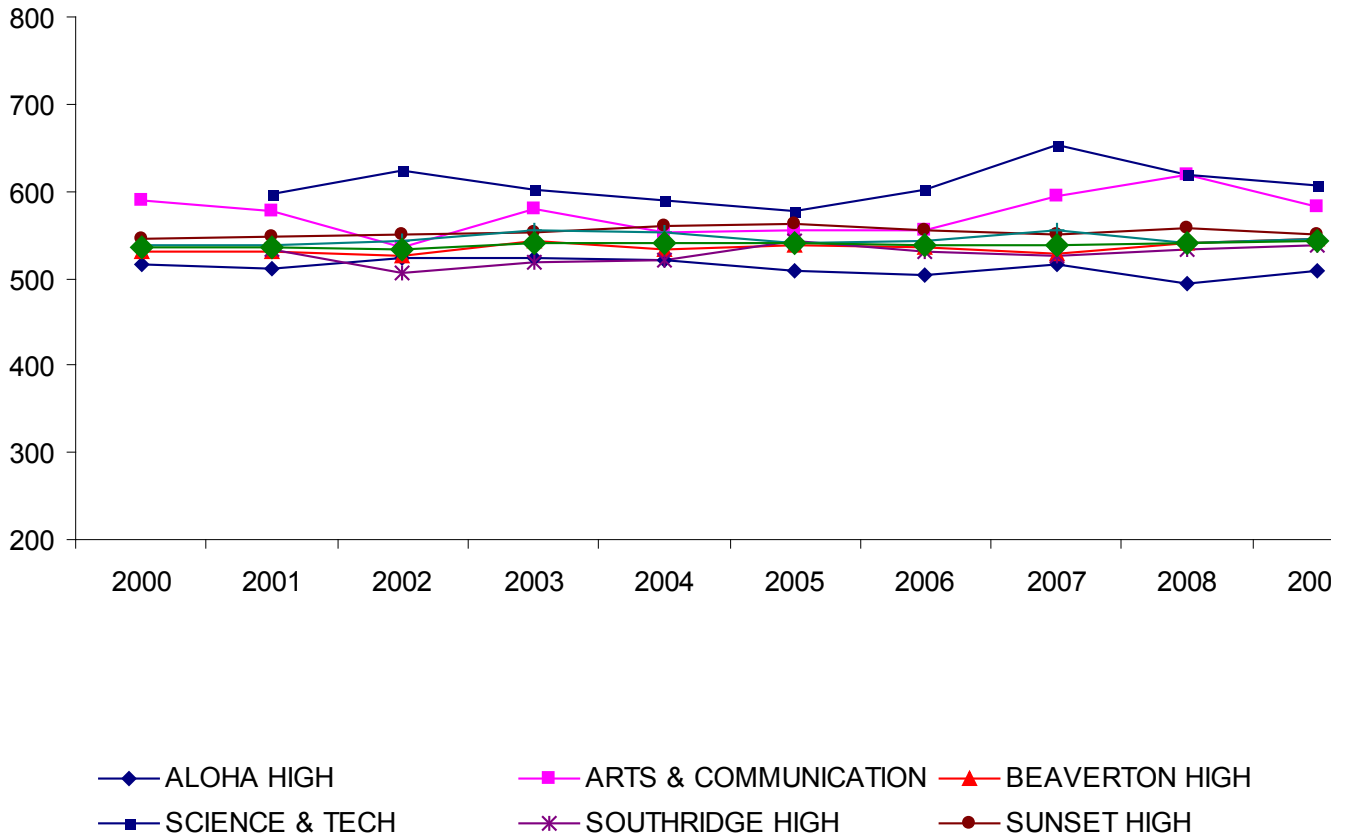

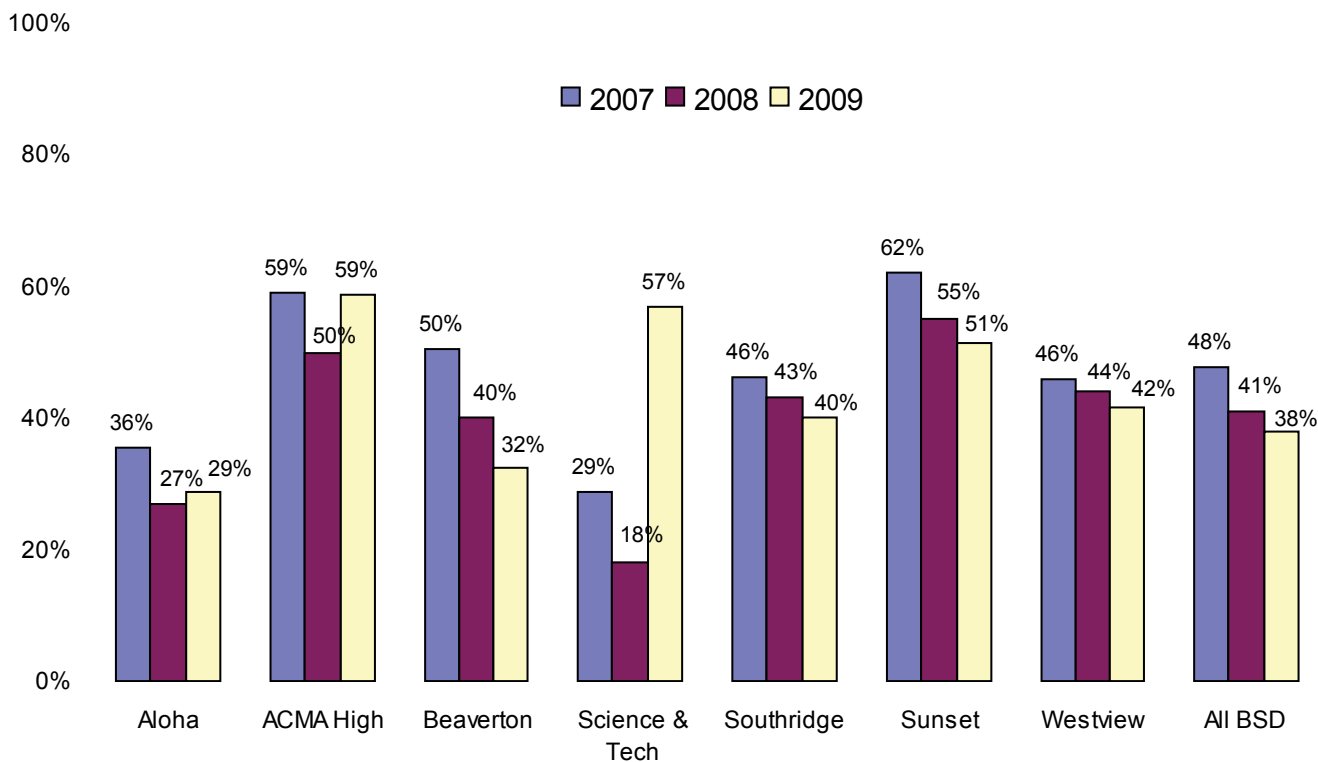

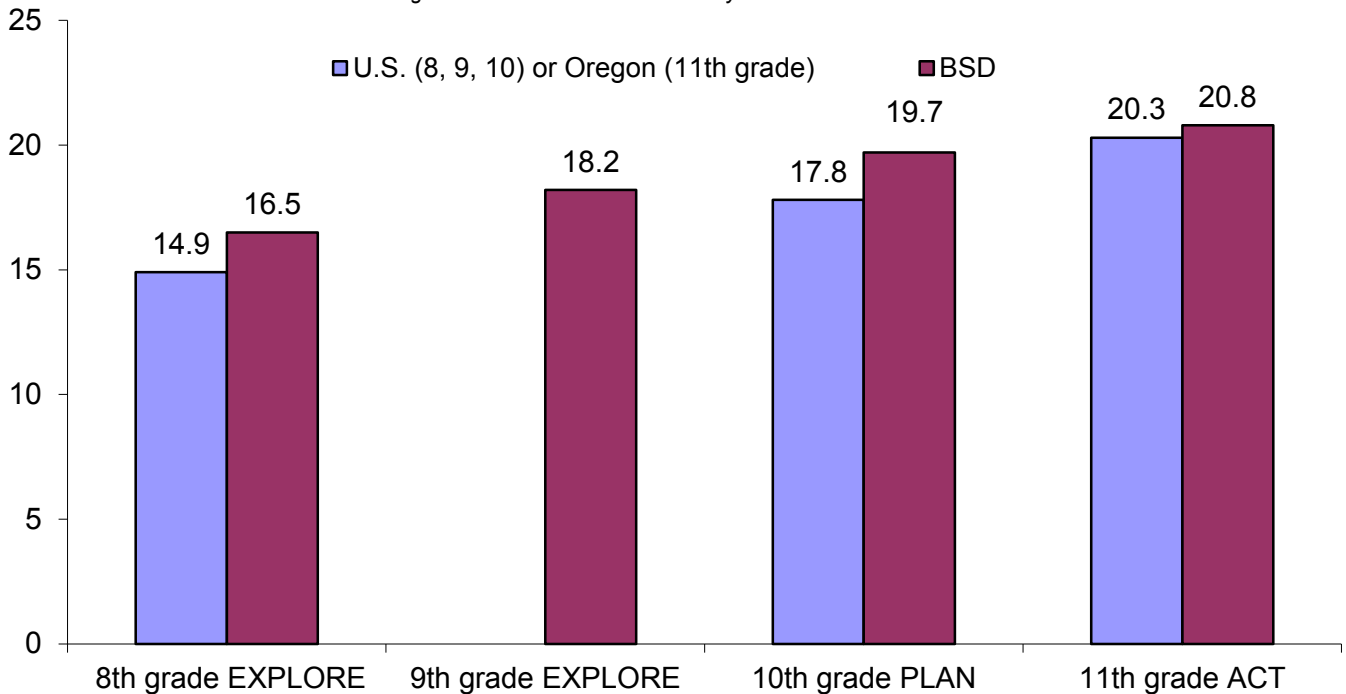
Beginning in 2005-06, Beaverton School District has funded the ACT series of tests (EXPLORE, PLAN, and ACT) for all 9th-11th grade students. The District added EXPLORE testing for 8th graders in 2006-07. Across the United States as a whole, the ACT test is mostly taken by 12th graders who are applying to college. In Beaverton, because the ACT test is required for all 11th graders, relatively few Beaverton 12th graders actually need to take the test. Those who want to improve their ACT scores to get into college, or who missed 11th grade testing, do take the 12th grade test.

The 2009-2010 ACT composite mean scores appear below. Beaverton students scored higher than the national and Oregon averages. Mean scores for the 9th grade are not yet available.

Test results for 9th, 10th, and 11th graders tend to show achievement gaps in familiar places. English Language Learners and Special Education students, as well as African-American and Hispanic students score lower on EXPLORE, PLAN, and ACT tests. Also, for most groups, higher percentages of students meet college readiness standards at earlier grade levels. Later grade level tests are geared to assess more advanced coursework, and in the past many older students have avoided these more rigorous courses, leading to lower test scores.

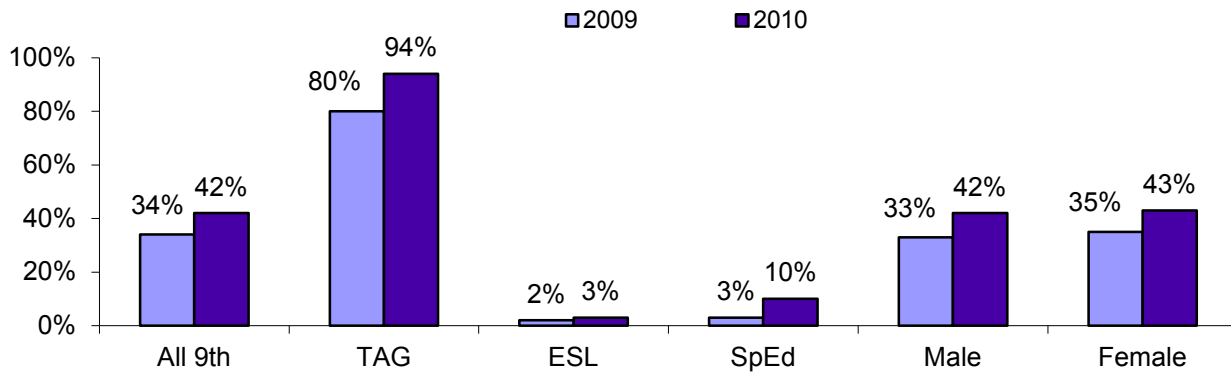

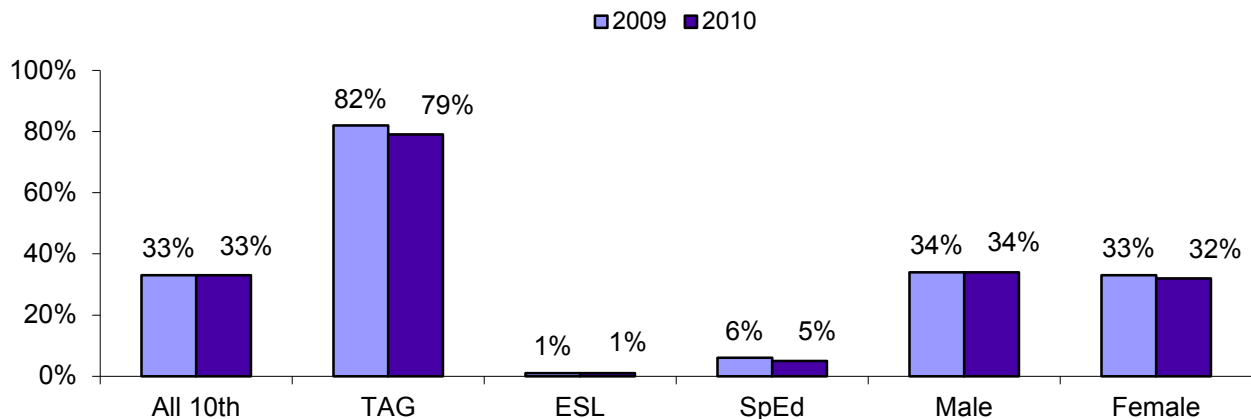

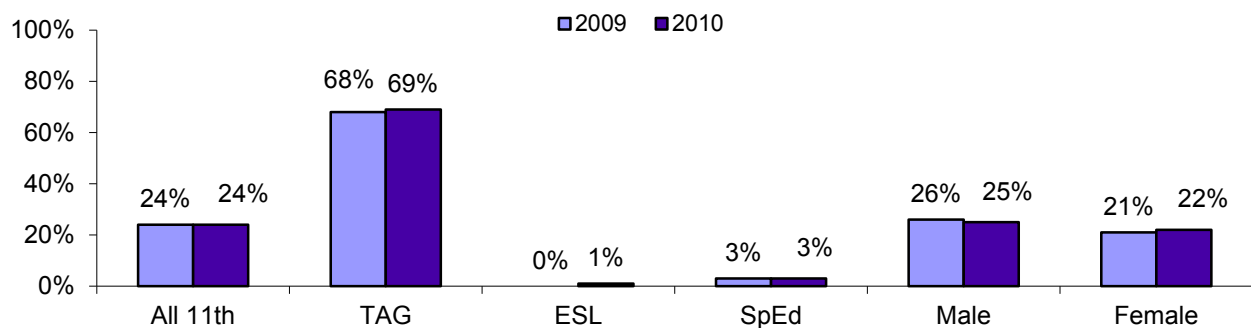
Percent of 9th Grade Sub-groups meeting all EXPLORE college readiness standards in English, Math, Social Studies, and Science

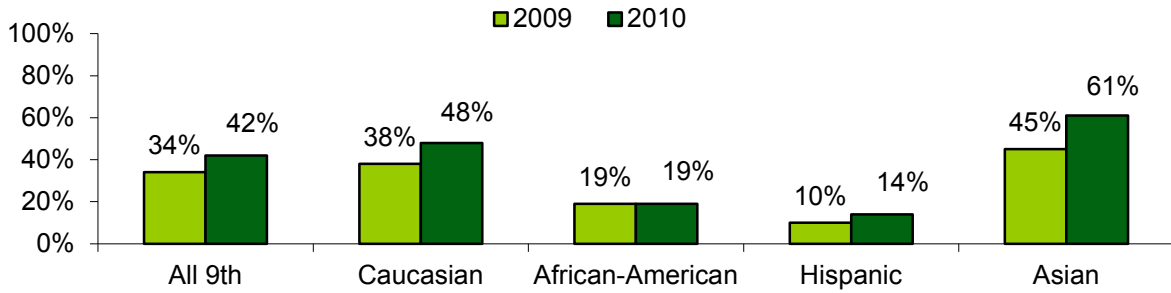

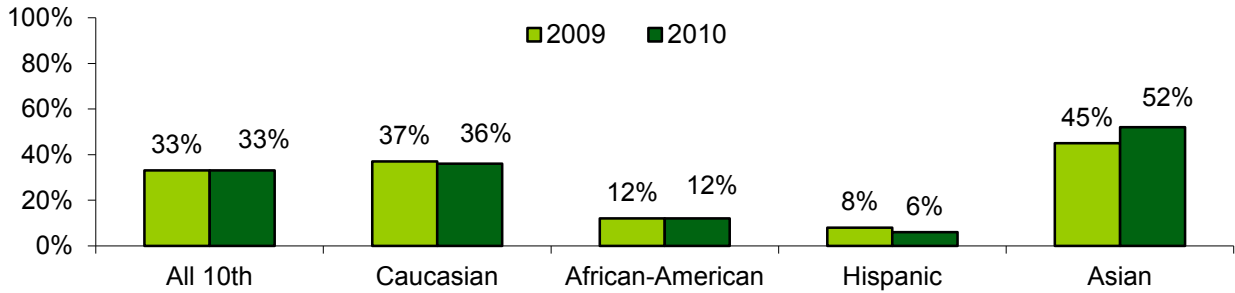

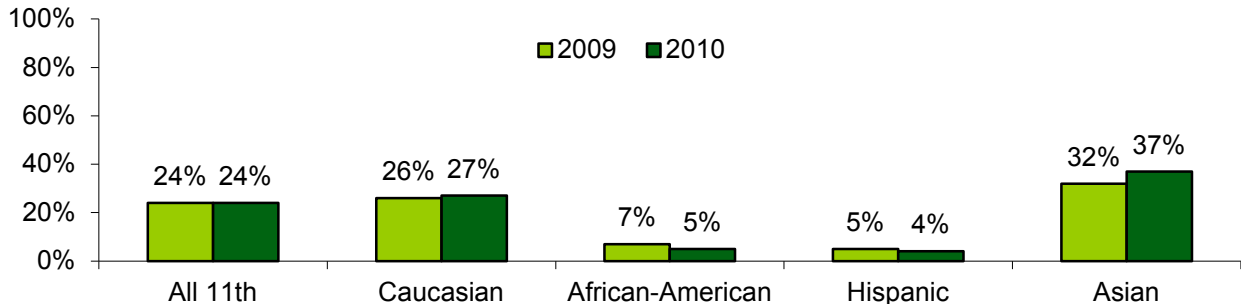
Percent of 9th grade ethnic groups meeting all college readiness standards in English, Math, Social Studies, and Science

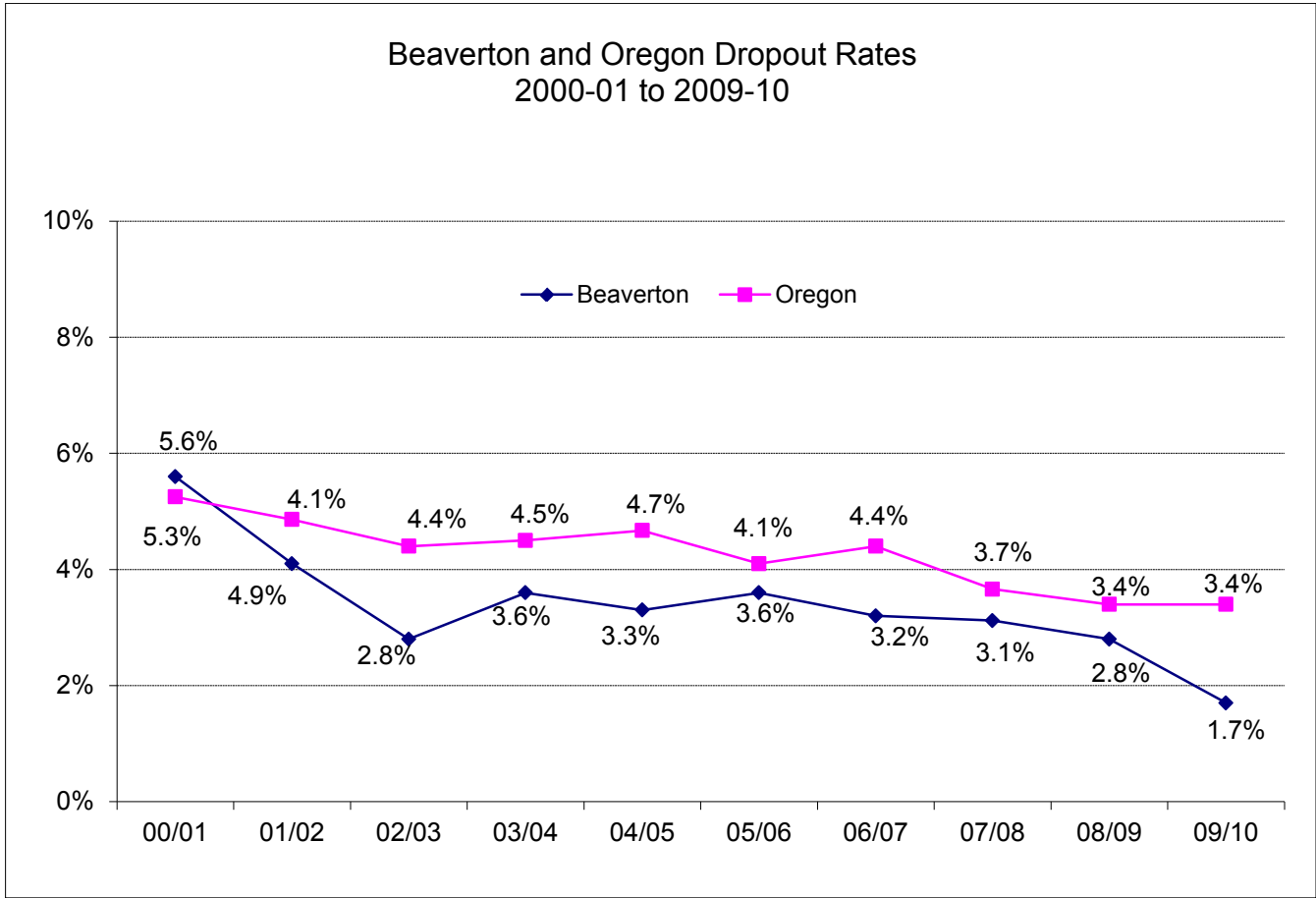

The dropout rate fell again in 2009-10, from 2.8% to 1.7%. The dropout rate for school year 2010-11 will be available in the spring of 2012, after the Oregon Department of Education tracks down students who left early and remain missing from their home districts after the summer break ends. Statewide dropout follow-up is a process that takes time, but results in a more accurate (and lower) rate of how many students really have discontinued their education prematurely.

Credit deficiency is the single most accurate predictor of students who drop out. Dropout rates tend to fall when the larger economy deteriorates, because young people cannot easily find work. Students with too few credits to graduate may nevertheless remain in school if they can't find work.

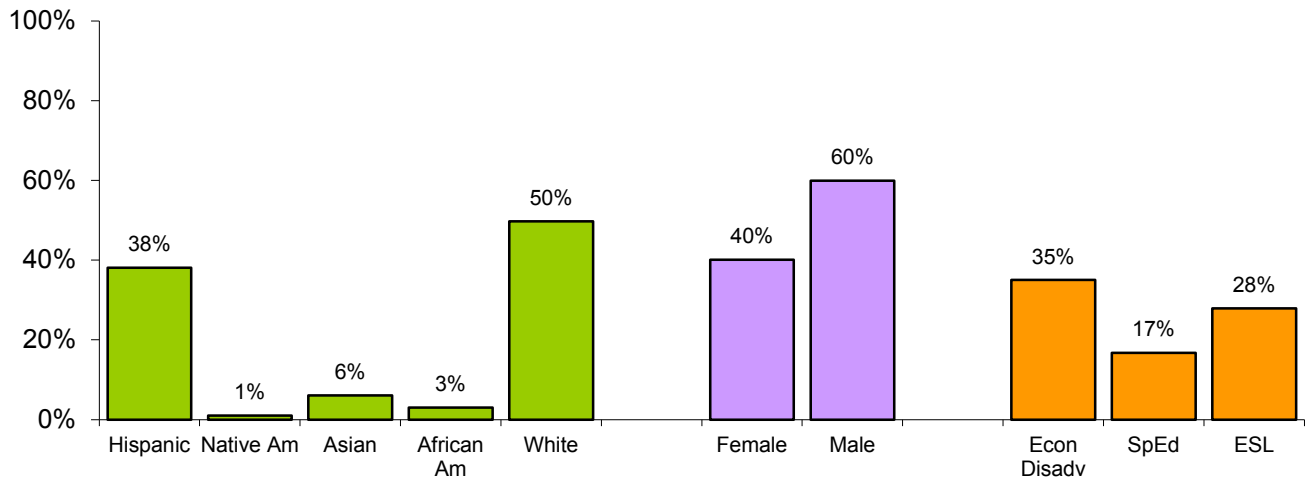

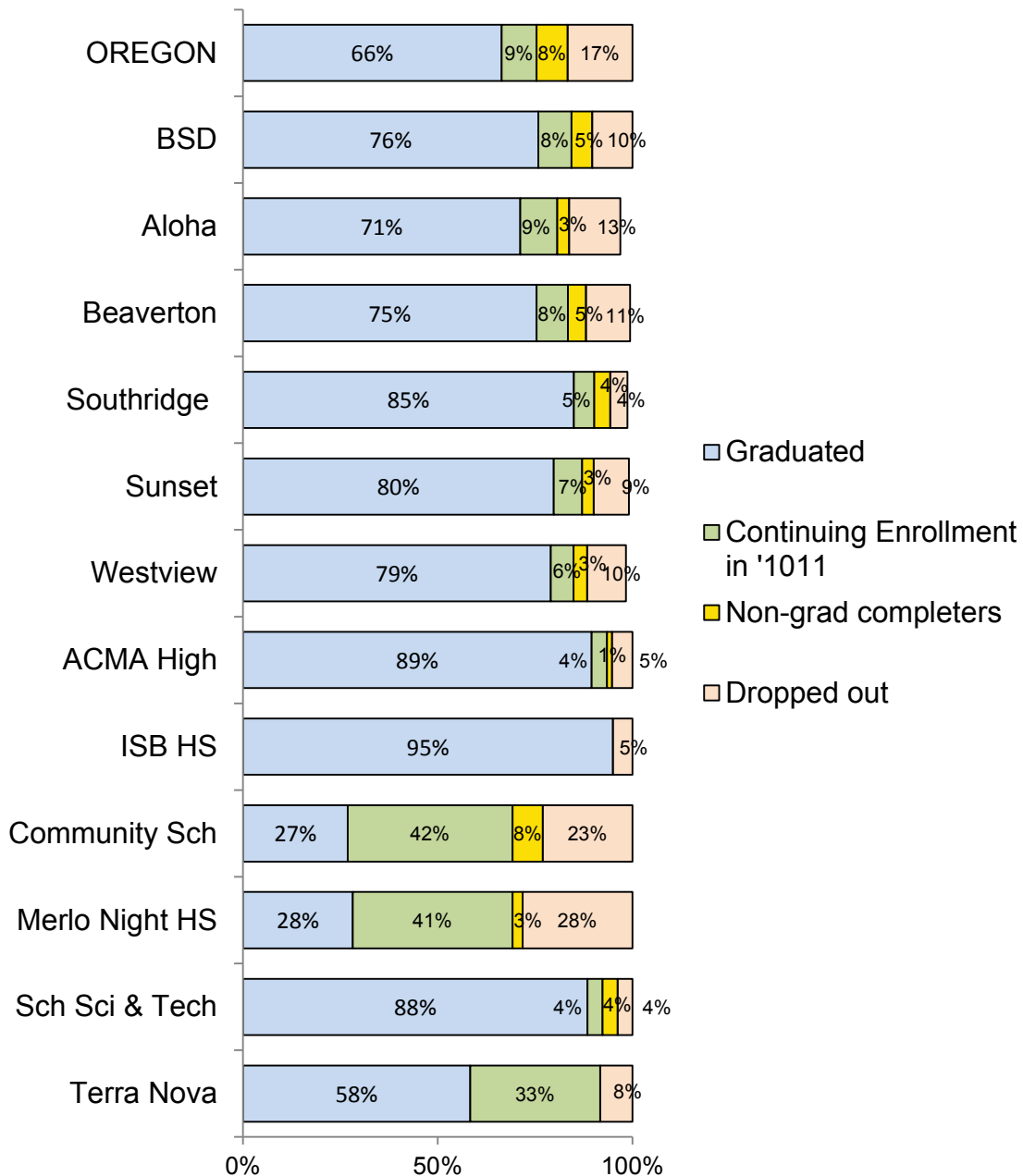

Beginning with the class of 2007-08, the Oregon Department of Education has published a set of four-year cohort rates to track incoming 9th graders for four years. The rates record graduation with a regular diploma in 4 years, continuing enrollment in the year following the original four years, non-graduating completion of high school (GED's and adult HS diplomas), and dropout.

For the cohort of 2009-10, Beaverton's 4-year graduation rate was 76%, compared with 66% at the State level. Students at Community School, Merlo Night High School, and Terra Nova were more likely than students at other Beaverton high schools to continue enrolled after 4 years, in an effort to graduate.

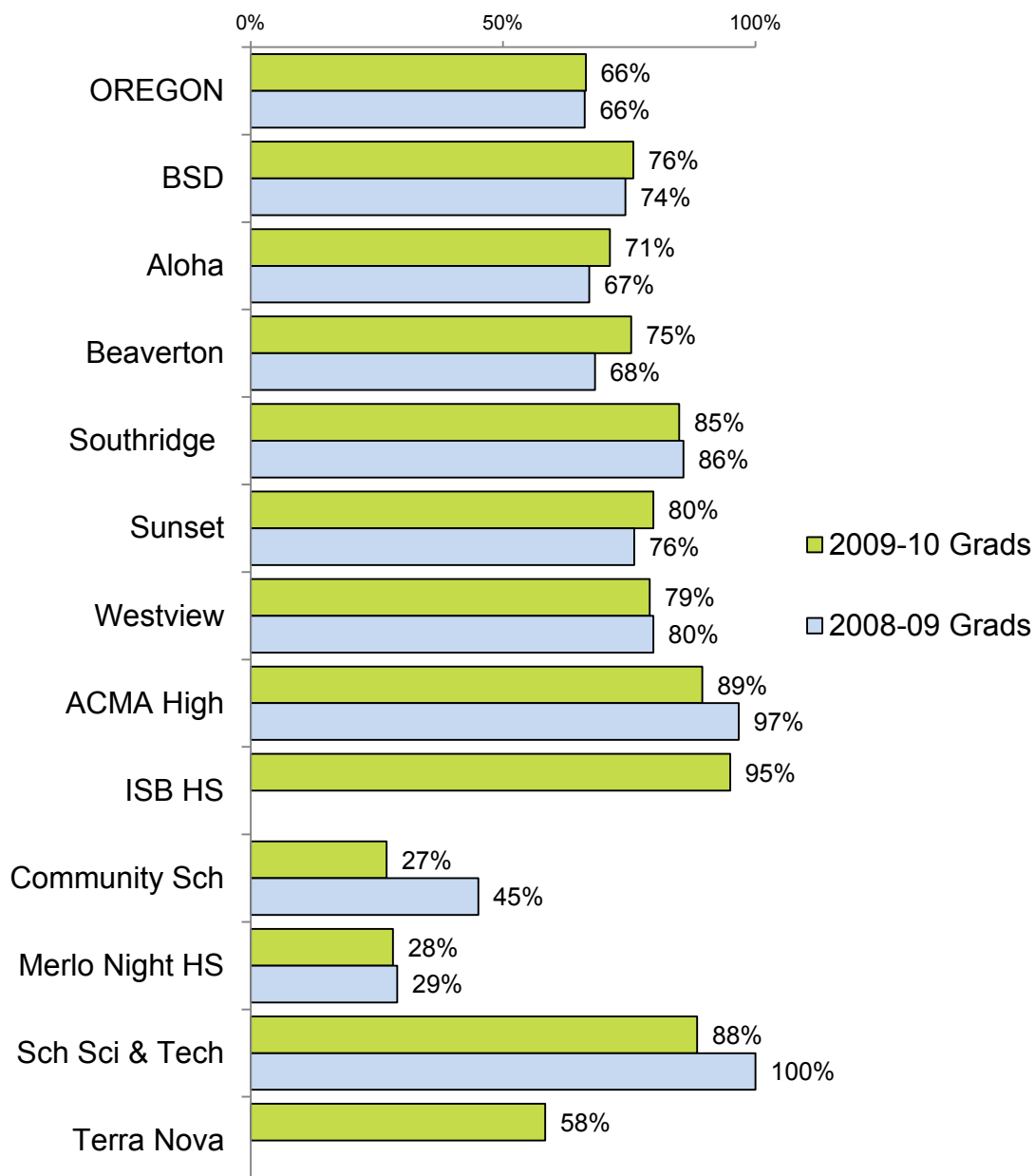

The 4-year cohort graduation rate tracks how many incoming 9th graders from four years ago finish high school four years later. There are now two years of ODE 4-year high school cohort rates available. Cohort graduation increased by 2% to 76% at Beaverton high schools from the 2008-09 to the 2009-10 school years. Graduation rates improved the most at Beaverton HS (up 7%), Aloha HS (up 4%), and Sunset HS (up 4%). Nevertheless, graduation rates fell at Community School (down 18%), Arts and Communication Magnet Academy (down 12%), and the School of Science and Technology (down 12%). The latter three are smaller high schools where individuals have a larger impact on percentages.

Listed on these pages are incidents that elicited suspension or expulsion actions on the part of school authorities. In '09-10 there were more suspensions and expulsions for non-compliance, fighting and assault, and alcohol and drug offenses. Truancy and non-compliance remained by far the most common offenses to elicit major discipline.

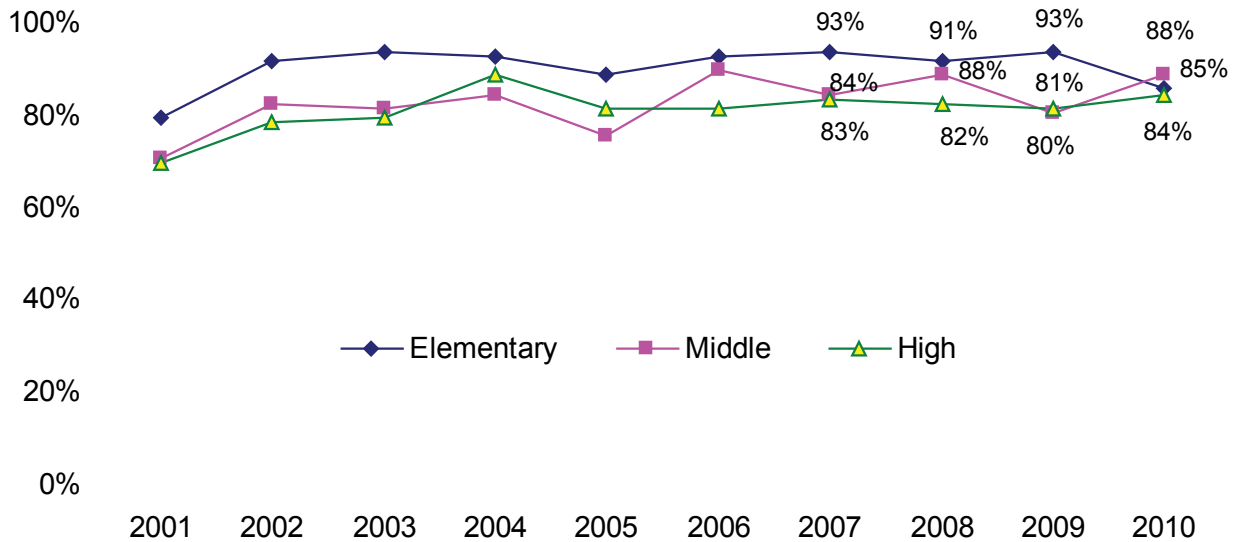
# PARENTS RATING THEIR CHILD'S SCHOOL 'A' OR 'B'

The Parent Survey is a telephone interview of a random sample of BSD parents. The sample yields results that represent the District as a whole with a confidence interval of 5% above or below the sample statistic. In 2010, for the first time parent ratings for their child's middle school rose higher than parent ratings for elementary schools (88% A's and B's compared to 85%). Parent ratings also rose at the high school level (from 81% to 84%) but fell from 93% to 85% at the elementary school level. In 2010, the Parent Survey response rate was 80%.

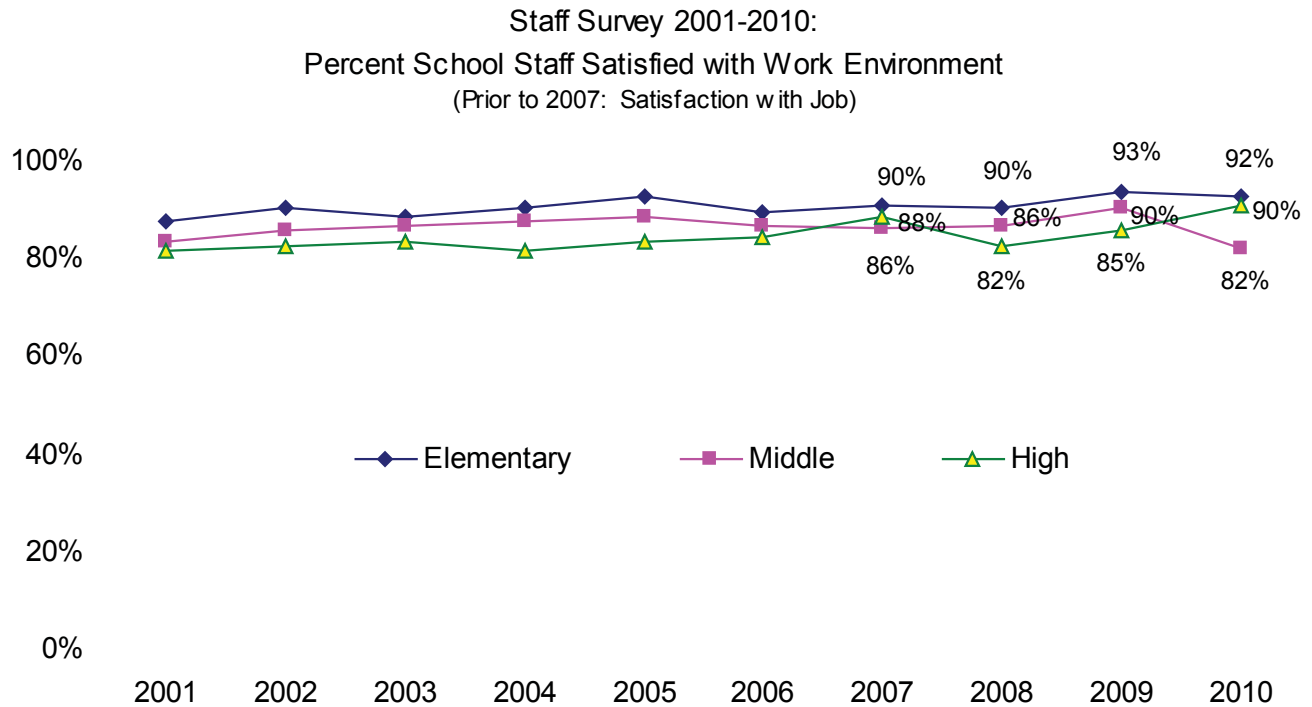

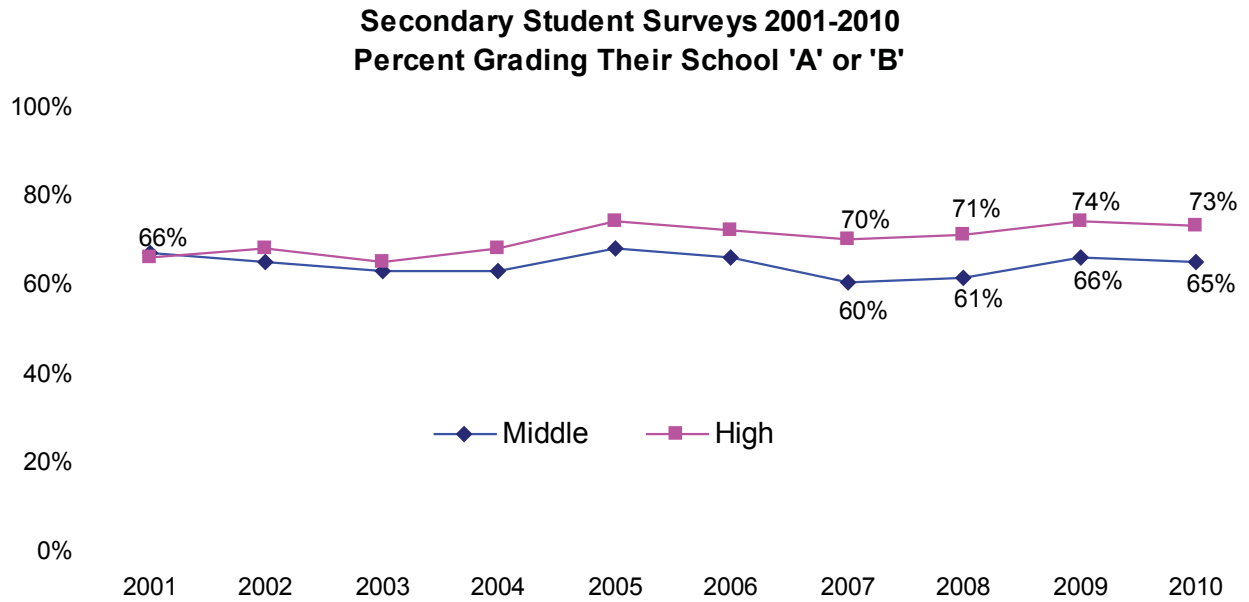

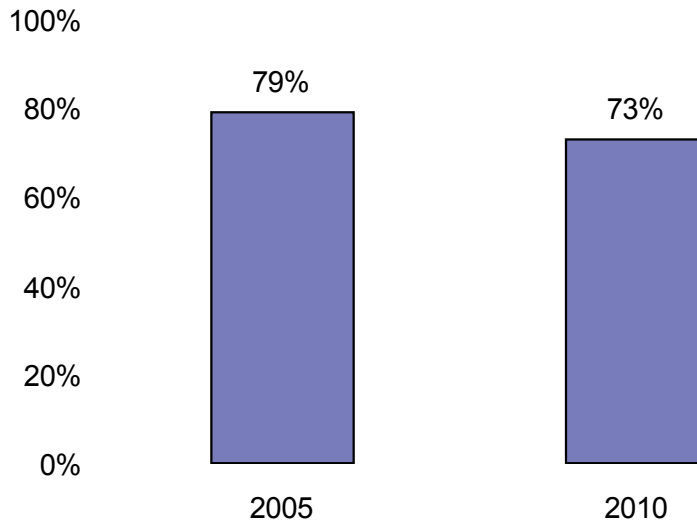
# ELEMENTARY STUDENTS RATE THEIR SCHOOLS

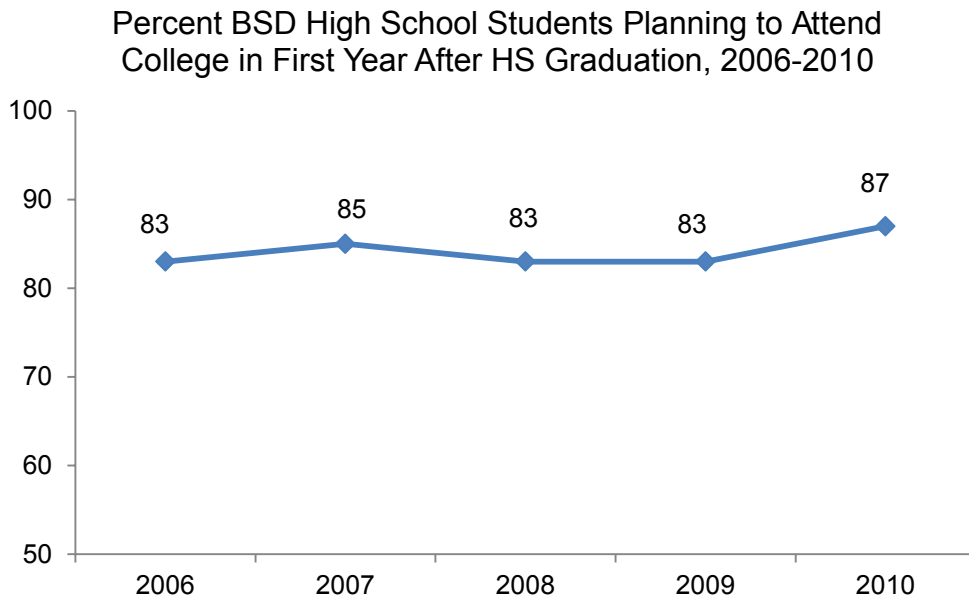

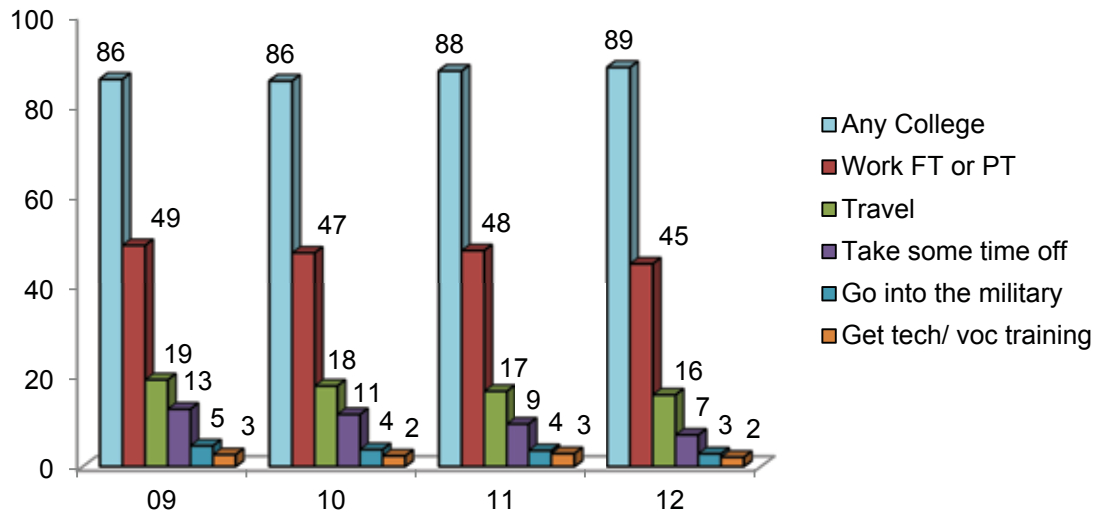

In responding to the Annual Survey, students may check any number of specific plans that they may have for the first year after their graduation from high school. Some students check only one plan, while others check several plans.

Attending college is the most common plan that high school students made for what to do after high school. From 86% to 89% indicated that they planned to attend a four-year college in or out of Oregon, or a community college. Students made other plans too. Nearly half of high school students (45%-49%) also planned to work full-time or part-time. Students planned to travel (16% to 19%). Around 7% to 13% of students planned to "take some time off" after graduation. About 5% or fewer planned to enter the military. From 2% to 3% of students indicated that they planned to seek technical or vocational training after graduation.
