No letters have been received by myself or any of my neighbors, There is a message posted to school parents through Parent Square stating that the project is happening this summer and they can attend a meeting if they have any questions. This is not public outreach for community engagement, it is an invitation to come and "let us tell you what we are doing". Additionally, in the Parent Square message it gives a contact for questions about the project (Kurt Meeuwsen). The email I sent to him with questions was blocked. This is not public outreach. Of course the safety of students is the highest priority. Is there any evidence that a fence actually improves the safety of a school? Could it actually do the opposite and keep kids from having an escape route into the community and delaying response time of first
					responders? Have any other options been explored other than an unsightly 6 ft. chain link fence? These are all valid questions that have not been addressed. What I am asking is that prior to our taxpayer money being spent, we have transparency and engagement when concerns are raised. All parties involved at BSD knew that there was community concern about this project. This has a feel of trying to push a project through under the radar to avoid community input.

					To Bond Accountability Committee members: I am a parent of two current BSD students and a proud alumnus of Oak Hills Elementary and Meadow Park. I am a huge supporter of the Beaverton School District and of the hard work that district employees and leaders do every day. Residents are aware that the school board has stated that they are working to increase communication and collaboration with communities and to clarify the processes in these areas, which I very much appreciate. I would like to call attention to the beginning of the last Bond Accountability Committee on 4/26/23, in which Shellie Bailey-Shah, BSD Public Communications Officer, stated that the outreach philosophy of the Bond Accountability Committee is to inform families, staff, and community members about bond projects prior to their start, acknowledging that this is more of a proactive strategy than has been done in the past, with the goal of increasing transparency and trust that the public places in the committee. The BAC then went on in the 4/26/23 meeting to have an approximately 80 second discussion in which they decided to proceed with the Oak Hills fencing project, despite zero community outreach or any response to direct requests from community members for information over the past year.
