Back to School Night Thanks

Thank you so much to all of you who joined us for Back to School Night this week. It was great to see you and to have you in the classrooms your students are in every day. We appreciate the time you spent with us.

BHS Fans

When it comes to filling the stands for athletic events, we have the strongest fan base around. This is a strong part of our tradition and we want to sustain that energy. Last year, and again this year, we are seeing behavior in our student crowds that are inappropriate and not tolerable. Today students will receive from me a reminder of the Metro League fan code. Key elements of the Code of Conduct include:

- Students are not to call out individual athletes from the other team (calling out jersey numbers, shouting personal details/traits, or criticizing their play);
- Students are not to taunt or call out at the referees, even if they disagree with a call in the game;
- As a safety measure, the OSAA (state organization) adopted a ban on baby powder at games. This is a statewide ban and brought on for health-related concerns.

We want our student fans to enjoy their time at BHS games and be present to support our teams. Being mean just for the fun of it and at another person's expense is not acceptable. Aspiring to be the "meanest fans in the Metro League" is not an admirable goal. Attending games is a right that comes with responsibilities. We continue to work with our student crowds to reinforce positive behavior. We appreciate you reinforcing this message at home as well.
